## Incoming 7th Summer Reading

The third book (which would be best to read in August) will be Refugee by Alan Gratz. You will be required to participate in a literature circle discussion about this book and take a brief quiz during the first weeks of school when you return to CHA.

## Postcard Assignment

Read the fiction book that you have selected for one of your choice books.. Then create a postcard about the book using the cardstock provided \*. Address the postcard to Mrs. Dorn. Include the date. Use the school's address as Mrs. Dorn's address. (1601 W. Mt. Harmony Road, Owings, MD 20736) Don't forget to draw a stamp! In your writing be sure to tell Mrs. Dorn the following:

- Title
- Author
- Genre
- Give a brief summary of what happened in the book.
- Tell about a connection you were able to make with the book or a character.

Be sure to include a closing and your signature.

On the flipside of the postcard, design an illustration that would give your partner a visual clue about the book. Include the title of the book. Consider using special lettering such as block or bubble letters for the title.
